#### IV. Fun activity-

Instructions:

- 1. **Assign Roles**: Divide the class into pairs or small groups. One will play the monkey, and the other will play the fox. If the class is large, more than one group can act at the same time.
- 2. **Set the Scene**: Tell the students that they are going to act out the story. The monkey is going to be distracted, playing and swinging on a tree, while the fox will be serious, walking straight ahead to the feast.
- 3. **Act Out the Story**:(The monkey (or group of monkeys) can pretend to swing on the tree, making fun sounds like "Whee! Whee!" while the fox (or group of foxes) will pretend to walk in a straight line toward the feast, saying things like "I need to get to the feast on time!"

Q Why did he miss the feast?

Q Why was the fox able to enjoy the feast?

Q What is the importance of being on time?



# Lesson-9The Golden Harvest (Hard Work)


*Hard work* means trying your best, putting in effort, and not giving up when doing something, in simple words, is what you do and how you do to achieve your goal.
