

Leaf pattern drawing







Distinctive Style: Known for its intricate patterns and vibrant colours, this art form is highly detailed and visually striking.







Traditional Art Form: Lippan art is a mural technique from Rajasthan, India, practiced by the Meena



Chapter 14 Wood Texture




